The iShuttle serves residents, employees and employers in the Irvine Spectrum Area and the Irvine Business Complex (IBC) by taking commuters and residents to and from work and home. These routes specifically connect commuters to morning and evening Metrolink and Amtrak trains from Irvine Station and Metrolink trains from Tustin Station. Bikeways

The City provides a system of on-street and off-street bikeways to encourage the use of a bicycle as a safe and convenient means of transportation for both commuting and recreational purposes. conserve energy

- ☀ Keep heat out of your apartment during the day by closing window shades and blinds.
- ☀ Use light-colored window shades to deflect sunlight from entering the apartment.
- ☀ Turn off unnecessary lights and make an effort to maximize use of natural sunlight.
- ☀ Unplug electronics, such as battery chargers, when they are not in use.
- ☀ Keep your thermostat at 78° or higher in the summer and 68° in the winter.



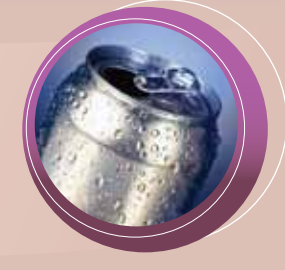
build green

- ☀ Green building creates environmentally sensitive, energy conscious, waste-reducing and healthier buildings that minimize harmful impacts on the environment.

prevent water pollution

- ☀ Dispose of your trash in a waste basket or recyclables (i.e. bottles, cans, etc.) in a recycling bin.
- ☀ Pick up after your dog in order to prevent pet waste from entering the storm drains.
- ☀ Prevent soapy, car wash runoff from entering the storm drains by taking your car to a commercial car wash facility. If washing your car at home, please use biodegradable soap.
- ☀ Reduce air pollution by car pooling, riding a bike, walking or taking public transportation.



reduce, reuse, recycle

- ☀ Ask your property manager about the location of the recycling bins at your apartment complex.
- ☀ Get **Cash Back for Bottles & Cans** at California Redemption Centers. For a list of recycling centers in Irvine please call 949-724-7669 or visit the Recycling section of cityofirvine.org/environmentalprograms. Earn 5 cents for containers less than 24 ounces and 10 cents for containers 24 ounces or more.
- ☀ Dispose of household hazardous waste (HHW) and electronic waste (free of charge) at a county HHW collection center. A center is located in Irvine at:

(closed holidays and rainy days)
- ☀ Donating unwanted items to charity instead of disposing of them in the trash.
- ☀ Use a reusable bag every time you go shopping.

What's the Environmental Impact?

If every American home replaced just one incandescent bulb with a CFL bulb, we would save enough energy to light more than 2.5 million homes for a year.

Green Buildings reduce carbon dioxide emissions by 40 percent, compared to conventional buildings.

Pollutants and trash that enter the storm drain system can cause beach closures and have a negative impact on marine life. By putting litter in the trash can, you are helping to keep the ocean clean and healthy.

Since 1987, Irvine residents have diverted more than 200 million pounds of recyclable materials from entering the landfills.
